PENNSYLVANIA BALLET OPENS 2010-2011 SEASON WITH *CARMEN*

Carmen Triple Bill

October 21-24 at the Academy of Music

***Concerto Barocco* by George Balanchine**

***Penumbra* by Matthew Neenan**

***Carmen* by Roland Petit**

Philadelphia, PA (September 22, 2010) – Pennsylvania Ballet ignites its 2010-2011 Season with a sizzling program featuring the Company premiere of Roland Petit’s *Carmen*, October 21-24 at the Academy of Music at Broad and Locust Streets. *Carmen Triple Bill* also includes *Concerto Barocco* by George Balanchine and *Penumbra* by Matthew Neenan, Pennsylvania Ballet’s Choreographer in Residence.

“Roland Petit’s *Carmen* expertly captures the drama of the theater in a beautifully choreographed ballet,” Artistic Director Roy Kaiser says. “The simplicity of *Concerto Barocco* and the elegance of *Penumbra* compliment this work perfectly. *Carmen Triple Bill* is sure to be one thrilling evening of dance.”

French-born choreographer Roland Petit’s seductive *Carmen* is an irresistible blend of sensuality, theatricality, and style. Inspired by the famous opera of the same name and set to Georges Bizet’s score, *Carmen* follows the torrid and tragic affair between its temptress title character and her lover, Don José. *Carmen*’s fiery movement and unbridled passion leave audiences breathless. Performed countless times overseas, Petit’s *Carmen* has not often been presented in the United States, making it a rare treat for Philadelphia audiences.

Concerto Barocco is itself a piece of Pennsylvania Ballet history. The first ballet George Balanchine ever gave to the Company, *Concerto Barocco* was featured in Pennsylvania Ballet’s very first program in 1963. Clean, pure, and exhilarating, *Concerto Barocco*’s choreography is a near-perfect reflection of the score crafted by Johann Sebastian Bach.

Matthew Neenan’s *Penumbra* is an intimate work for five dancers. First premiered by Pennsylvania Ballet in June 2008, *Penumbra* quickly became a favorite of the dancers to perform, with lots of partnering and interaction among them. The piece is set to an Alberto Ginastera score for cello and piano that creates a somber yet sweet mood on stage.
